Changes and Growing Pains

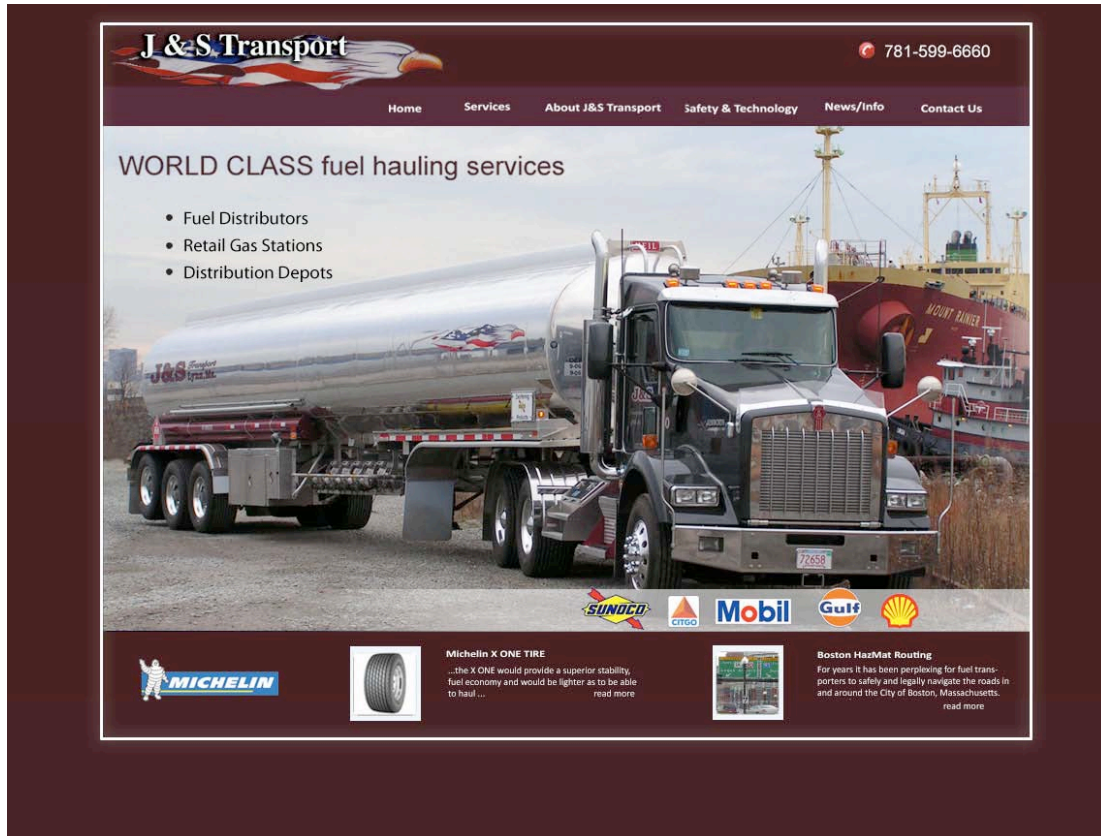

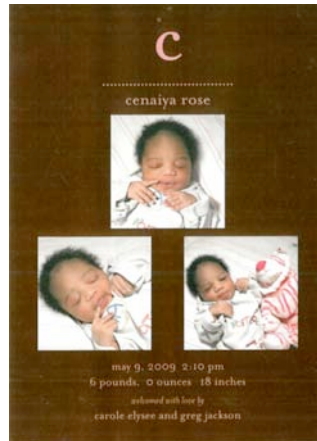
